

### Jarvis midgets champions

Jarvis scored three first period goals and then hung on to defeat the Fisherville team with some great goal tending and some solid body hitting. Don Fess was set up by Steve Fess and Doug Simpson for the first goal of the game that gave Jarvis a 1-0 lead. Two minutes later Jack Adamovich, who was the outstanding player on the ice, made it 2-0 when he knocked in Wayne O'Shell's rebound. 
