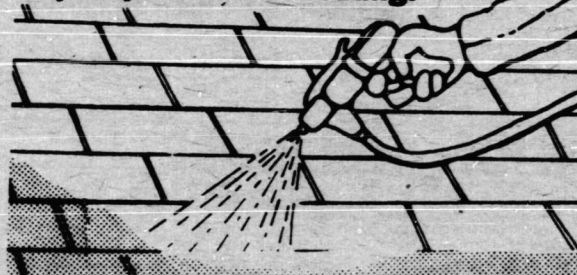

In addition to a new four lane highway, the corridor will contain a number of utilities. This will be the first application of the Joint Use Corridor Concept in the province.
