Soil testing is one of the regular farm chores at this time of year. Samples can be taken whenever time is available. Processing at the Soils Lab at Guelph is provided free of charge. Adjustments are made for factors such as manure that is to be applied. Results are compared with the requirement for the crop planned to indicate the fertilizer requirement.

Testing has always paid off with the best results for the lowest investment in added fertility. If it is not possible to get samples to Guelph before December 1, they could be left at Corn Night. Each year soil samples have been left at this annual event at St. Michael's Parish Hall for shipment to the Guelph Lab.

Beef producers are invited to attend a feedlot meeting at Holiday Inn, Brantford on November 25 starting at 8:00 p.m. This is one of the regular series of regional meetings for beef producers. Gary Stephens at the agriculture office Cayuga would welcome enquiries about the program.
