On the Farm Front

A federal hog outlook summary indicates that hog prices will continue high through this fall. Anticipated lower farrowings will likely see a decreased hog slaughter through the first half of 1976. Increased production by the second half of 1976 is expected to weaken.

A shortage of beef in two to three years is expected along with higher prices to consumers. The present heavy slaughter of breeding animals is expected to continue into 1976. Smaller calf crops are likely to begin in 1976. Most of the reduction in the cattle herd will be felt at the marketplace in following years.

Haldimand Holstein Breeders annual sale is to be held at the farm of Blake Stadler, Selkirk, starting at 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday October 22.

Dates to reserve include October 29 for Haldimand Federation of Agriculture annual meeting and Nov. 1 for the Haldimand Junior Farmer Banquet. Royal Agricultural Winter Fair dates are November 14 to 22. Haldimand 4-H Awards will be presented on the evening of Wednesday, November 12.

Prevention of insect problems in stored grain is often easier and less costly than control after damage starts. Prevention includes cleaning and where necessary treating with an insecticide such as malathion. Control after the grain is in the bin includes treatment with one of the many commercial fumigants available containing materials such as methyl bromide or phostoxin. LABEL DIRECTIONS MUST BE FOLLOWED. Other products used in grain bin fumigation are only available to licensed operators. Publication 229 - Insects in Farm Stored Grain is available for those who require further information.

According to information from the Crop Science Department at Guelph the combination of higher value for the corn crop and higher costs for drying corn make high moisture corn and treatment with organic acids a reasonable alternative for corn crop storage. Acids such as propionic acid can also be applied with applicators that are now more accurate.

If you are employed and going to have a baby, you're entitled to pregnancy leave.



We have a law in Ontario which permits any pregnant woman, married or not, to take a 17-week unpaid leave of absence to have her baby. This law covers part-time as well as full-time employees, provided that they have been working for the same employer for at least 63 weeks before the expected date of birth.

When she returns to work, the new mother is guaranteed the right to her former position or to a comparable position with no loss of seniority or benefits.

Naturally, pregnancy does not prevent an employee from being dismissed for valid reasons not connected with pregnancy, but pregnancy alone cannot be the cause of dismissal where an employee is eligible for leave.

An expectant mother is required to give two weeks' notice in writing of the day she intends to leave. She is entitled to begin her leave any time within 11 weeks before the baby's birth but she must take at least six weeks of her leave afterwards. If the employer wishes the employee to begin her leave before she wants to do so, the employer must prove that she is unable to perform her normal duties adequately.

The employee is eligible for Unemployment Insurance benefits during her pregnancy leave (even if she does not intend to resume work when her leave expires) if she had at least 20 weeks of insured employment during the year before the birth. At least ten of the 20 weeks should have fallen between the 30th and the 50th weeks before the birth.

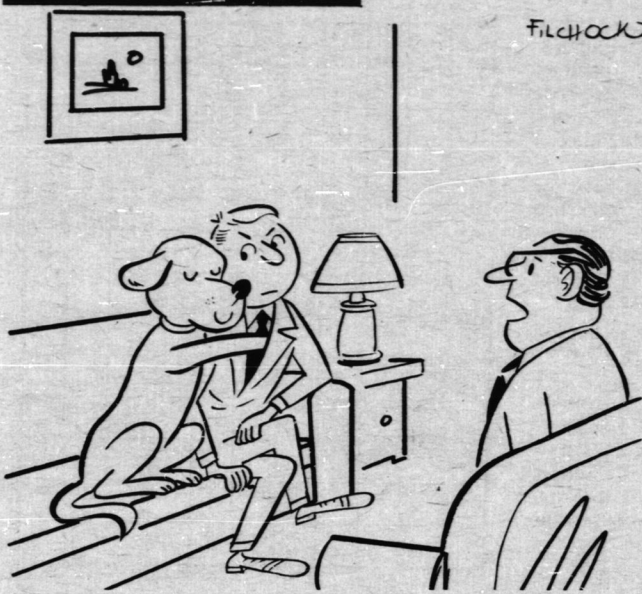
we refer to is a mixture of older boys and some first year midgets that look like they will stick with the club.
