### New agricultural plans unveiled by Premier Davis

TORONTO—Premier William Davis has pledged his government to take several steps to ensure that Ontario food crops are harvested to the maximum benefit of producers and consumers.

The Premier, in a recent speech, stressed that "the waste of food through crop losses is both senseless and callous."

"It is a direct threat to the survival of agriculture, a direct charge upon the farmer, a ultimate charge to the consumer and an affront to common sense and reason," he said.

Davis, campaigning for reelection of his Progressive Conservative government on September 18th, identified as one problem the need to ensure a sufficient supply of seasonal workers to harvest fruit and vegetable crops across Ontario.

Acknowledging that "there is the problem of the casual worker sometimes being too casual, the problem caused by leaving the job before it is finished," the Premier called on the federal government to extend the qualifying period for unemployment insurance from eight to 12 weeks so that transient workers will be less tempted to withdraw from the labour force after only two months work.

He also said that, since "I believe in work incentives," particularly for young people seeking to finance an education, his government would introduce an income tax rebate policy to allow seasonal farm workers to claim rebate from their provincial income tax payable of as much as \$150. At the same time, he proposed that, as a matter of national policy, the federal government extend a \$1,000 tax exemption to any Canadian engaged in seasonal work on the farm.

Davis also stressed the need to ensure that the harvesting of Ontario food crops is not jeopardized by protracted labour disputes. He noted that recent amendments to the Labour Relations Act, legislated by the PC government, were designed to help settle such disputes "fairly and expeditiously."

"If we are going to grow food — and we do not really have the choice — we have to make sure that it is not only grown, but harvested, and not only harvested, but stored or processed as well," the Premier said.

"And we have to do all we can to ensure that both the farmer and the consumer are not victimized when crops are lost and artificial shortages result because of labour-management disputes over which neither the farmer nor the consumer have any control or bear any responsibility."

Davis said the preservation of prime land for agriculture was basic to his government's land use policy.

"If we cannot farm, our people cannot be fed," he said. "If we cannot be fed, we begin a dependence on others, and as we become dependent on others, we lose for all time our sense of self-sufficiency, of providing for ourselves. And this would change the life and spirit of Ontario beyond recognition."

The Premier said governments, federal and provincial, have to assume greater responsibility "in support of the universal need for food."

"I believe practical measures can be taken that will be effective if governments, in making a commitment to agriculture, support that commitment with courage," he said.
