INSTRUCTIONS TO WALKERS

1. You must be registered before you begin the walk. Register at the Jarvis Community Hall anytime between 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m.
2. Be sure the total amount per mile on the sponsor sheet is totalled down before you hand the sponsor sheet to the registrars.
3. The registrar will retain your sponsor sheet for safe keeping and give you a numbered card which will be required to be shown by you, for identification at the check points.
4. There are three (3) check points, plus the finish line at the hall. You must be checked off at each of the check points.
5. If you complete the walk, the checker at the finish line in the hall will enter the total number of miles walked (15) and sign your sponsor sheet as verification. The sponsor sheet will then be returned to you.
6. If you drop out along the route you will be picked up by official cars - clearly marked. They will return you to the finish line and verify your sponsor sheet as to the number of miles covered.
7. Walkers must be finished and off the course by 5:00 p.m. other wise they will be picked up by official cars.
8. Children under the age of 12 years must be accompanied by a responsible person 16 years of age or over.
9. Walk on the "left hand" side of the road, facing traffic when sidewalk are not available.
10. **UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES ACCEPT RIDES IN UNMARKED CARS OR FROM STRANGERS.** There will be plenty of official cars patrolling the route which makes this unnecessary.
11. Walkers are obligated to collect from their sponsors after completing the walk and turn in the proceeds, as soon as possible, but no later than September 27th, 1975.
