From now to January 4 the Village staff demonstrate how settlers prepared and observed the Yule. The Village houses display the simple decorations of the period -- wreaths of evergreen boughs, garlands of cranberries and popcorn and the traditional kissing balls. The kitchens are filled with the aromas of freshly baked fancy breads, cakes, mince-meat and puddings.

To add to the Christmas scene at Black Creek, the Philip's Lutheran Church in Islington will sing Christmas carols in various locations through the Village each Saturday and Sunday afternoon between 2:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m., up to


