Use of weed control chemicals can be energy saving. While it takes energy to produce the chemicals, their use can reduce the amount of energy that otherwise might be used for weed control such as with cultivation.

Results over 10 years in the Ridgeway area have indicated that the soil test is a good predictor of potash requirement for crops. Where potash is not required according to the test then no increase in yield results from potash application. The clay soils in Halidmand are high in potash. The need of crops with the highest potash requirement is met according to the soil test in the Halidmand clay soil. The Ridgeway results confirm local Soil and Crop Improvement trials that showed no need for added potash under these conditions.
