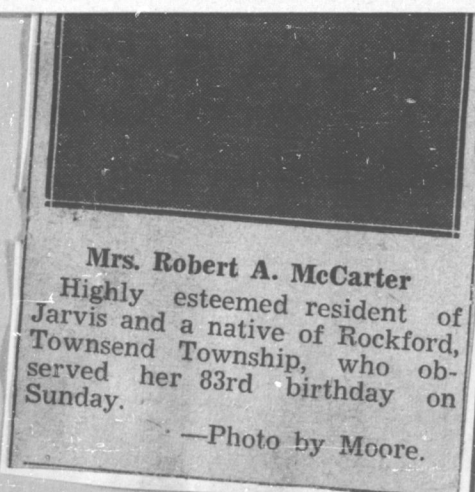
Keep us, O Lord, from pettiness; let us be large in thought, in word and deed;
